All you have to do is read both books by the end of August to be entered in a drawing for a gift card to one of the many local businesses here in town! This year's recommending author is Gerry Boyle and he has chosen two books that I think patrons will find really interesting! The first is *Mainely Power* by Matt Cost. In this mystery about Private Investigator Goff Langdon, who also happens to own a bookstore, small town life is about to change. When investigating his latest case, he uncovers corrupt cops, crooked politicians, greedy millionaires, radical environmentalists, and a deadly assassin named Shakespeare. Follow Langdon and his band of friends as they attempt to untangle the web of intrigue and return Brunswick to 'the way life should be'. \* The second book is *Mill Town* by Kerri Arsenault. In this biography we learn about the paper mill in Mexico, ME. that, while providing livelihoods for nearly everyone, also contributed to the destruction of the environment and the decline of the town's economic, physical, and emotional health in a slow-moving catastrophe, earning the area the nickname "Cancer Valley." *Mill Town* is a moral wake-up call that asks, whose lives are we willing to sacrifice for our own survival? \*

Since the Maine CDC has updated its requirements and has gotten rid of social distancing we are moving forward with reopening the library. All computers will be available and chairs will be at each table in the reading room. We have lifted time limits for the computers, browsing and working at the tables! 
